**Teaching languages**

Icelandic, Dutch

**Position of the course**

This is a beginners course in Icelandic, positioned at the third year of the Bachelor program.

### **Contents**

The course focuses on the grammar of Icelandic, its sound system, inflectional and derivational system and syntax. The main emphasis will be on reading modern Icelandic texts and on exercises involving pronunciation and grammar, leading to basic proficiency in the modern language. The student will become familiar with Icelandic dictionaries and other reference material.

### **Initial competences**

No specific prerequisites.

### **Final competences**

- 1 The student should be able to formulate simple Icelandic sentences
- 2 The student should be able to read and account for the content of elementary modern Icelandic texts
- 3 The student should be able to master central aspects of Icelandic morphology and syntax
- 4 The student should be able to use dictionaries and reference grammars
- 5 The student is familiar with the most important phonological features of Modern Icelandic and can also apply them (cf. pronunciation exam)

Seminar, Independent work

### **Extra information on the teaching methods**

This course is both theoretical and practical in nature. The theoretical component focuses on the most important grammatical and phonological features of Icelandic, both of which will regularly be practiced in class. The practical component of this course will acquaint the students with a basic vocabulary, which will be introduced through a series of dialogues. Independent work involves grammar exercises and writing short texts.
