**Position of the course**

In Swedish Literature I and III, students engage in text-oriented analysis of prose texts; in Swedish Literature II and III, students deepen their knowledge of literary historical developments. This advanced course combines the literary-historical and text-oriented dimensions with specific attention to poetry as genre.

**Contents**

Through active reading, analysis and discussion of representative poetry collections/poems, this course offers a concise historical overview of the most important developments in Swedish poetry history from Bellman to the present day and introduces students to poetry as a specific (?) language act.

**Initial competences**

To have successfully completed the courses Swedish literature II & III or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

**Final competences**

- 1 To have acquired a deepened knowledge of Swedish literary history, especially with regard to poetry as genre.
- 2 To have gained deepened insight in text-oriented analysis of poetry.
- 3 To adequately apply literary historical knowledge when analysing poetry.
- 4 To adequately confront own insights with insights from literary studies when analysing poetry.
- 5 To be able to give an oral presentation of a textual analysis and to participate in a discussion on it.
- 6 To be able to write a textual analysis in good and coherent Swedish (C1), without

using GAI tools in text production and/or editing.
