1 General Courses

87 credits

Students who already have a Master's degree in Philosophy, Moral Sciences or Philosophy and Moral Sciences are exempted from the advanced optional courses (1.1), 2 of the 5 research seminars (1.3), the course Advanced Academic English (1.4) and the elective courses (2).

Students following the standard learning track take 39 credits from the advanced optional courses and the elective courses in the first year. This will be supplemented by 3 credits language proficiency and 18 credits of research seminars. In the second year, 27 credits are chosen from the research seminars, aside from the research project and the master's dissertation.
