1 General Courses

100 credits

The Summer and Winter School (EMGS interuniversity courses, 10 credit units) are compulsory courses for each student.

To choose: 90 credit units out of 2 main modules (1.1 - 1.5). Subject to approval by the faculty.

The student takes courses at two of the universities mentioned below, in accordance with his or her mobility scheme, approved by the Steering Committee.

For a full programme 120 credit units have to be obtained. Each student studies for one year at one of the European partner institutions, and for the second year at another European partner institution. The five European partner universities are:

- Ghent University (Belgium)
- Leipzig University (Germany)
- Roskilde University (Denmark)
- University of Vienna (Austria)
- University of Wroclaw (Poland)

As an additional mobility track, students have the option to spend the third semester at one of the non-European partner universities subject to approval by the Steering Committee.
