Position of the course

This course is one of the eighteen research seminars that constitute the core of the master programme. Depending on initial qualifications, students enrol for three or five such research seminars.

Contents

The seminar consists of a series of minimally 5 meetings devoted to an overarching topic in continental philosophy (i.e. a theme, book or author). The topic is to be determined each year, depending on the expertise at hand and contemporary relevance. During the meetings students discuss and exchange, under the guidance of a lecturer or tutor, prominent themes in contemporary continental philosophy. Each meeting is coordinated by one of the tutors (who may be assisted by a post-doc or a PhD student enrolled for the seminar). The coordinator makes sure that there is a list of relevant literature made available in the beginning of the academic year. Meetings are organized in Ghent, on Friday afternoon.

The aim of this seminar is to incite beginning researchers to set up innovating and articulate academic research up to date with current literature, and to give shape to their thought in one or more papers ready for submission to a peer reviewed journal. The assessment is continuous and end-of-term, and concerns the participation during the meetings, the preparation of the paper(s), the contribution to a research proposal, and the final paper(s).
