## Position of the course

Students will engage in a 6-8 week period of Professional Practice in one of the IMBRSea (main or associated) partners. Those partners include universities, research stations, companies and NGOs. During Professional Practice students will work under the guidance of a mentor in this host organisation and an academic supervisor from the partner universities.

## Contents

The main objective of the IMBRSea Professional Practice is for the student to become familiar with different work functions and roles expected for a particular profession. The Professional Practice should allow the student to understand how knowledge acquired through formal learning may be applied to solving problems in real-world situations. Over the Professional Practice the student will be immersed in the working environment and will get acquainted with real-life job world.

## Extra information on the examination methods

The evaluation of the professional practice will be based on several elements:

- 1 An online reflective portfolio
- 2 A final reflective report
- 3 An evaluation by the Professional Practice mentor on student's performance and adaptation to the working environment
- 4 An exhibition stand at the Annual Symposium or at the Summer School\* in which the professional practice is presented.

In their Reflective Portfolio learners will be expected to explain how their Professional Practice experience fulfils the learning outcomes of the module and will be expected to provide evidence to support their explanations.

Further guidelines on the online reflective portfolio and the final reflective report are provided in the Professional Practice Guidelines.

## Calculation of the examination mark

The online reflective portfolio counts for 10%, the final reflective report counts for 60%, and the Professional-practice exhibition presentation counts for 30% of the final grade.

The exhibition presentation occurs either in the IMBRSea Summer School or at the Annual Symposium - this is defined by the IMBRSea educational board and communicated to all students in due time. All students are expected to be physically present to present their Professional practice exhibition.
