POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE COMPUTER-ASSISTED LANGUAGE MEDIATION

60 ECTS CREDITS - LANGUAGE: ENGLISH

WHAT

The CALM postgraduate programme equips students for successful careers in the language, translation and communication industry. In today's professional translation environments, essential tools include translation memory and terminology management systems, data mining tools and software for speech recognition and machine translation. Language and communication professionals increasingly rely on workflow and content management systems and authoring tools. Additionally, maintaining web pages and social media channels have become part of their fundamental skills set.

As the landscape of language and communication technologies evolves, knowledge of natural language processing (NLP) and Python programming are crucial. These skills enable students to analyse and process human language more efficiently and develop robust applications. The integration of technology in learning and teaching also supports language learning through digital resources and communication technology applications. The CALM postgraduate curriculum equips students with essential technological skills for today's information society. It complements language and communication degrees such as Masters in Translation, Interpreting, Multilingual Communication, Languages and Literature, Journalism Studies, Communication Studies, etc. Industry collaboration is a key aspect of the programme. Students get the opportunity to gain real-world insights through guest lectures by strategic industry partners and a three-month work placement, providing relevant and hands-on experience in applying the acquired technological skills.

STRUCTURE

The CALM postgraduate course is a one-year academic programme consisting of 60 credits. Students select 8 modules (of 5 credits each) out of 13 modules offered, depending on their interests. The modules are complemented by a 3-month work placement with a company in the language, translation or communication industry (20 credits). All teaching is carried out in English. Therefore, students must have sufficient fluency in written and spoken English (CEFR level B2) to cope with the course. For some translation-oriented courses knowledge of Dutch, French or German is also required. All modules are taught in the first two trimesters of the academic year, followed by the work placement. Students who prefer not to enrol for the entire postgraduate programme can create a personalized curriculum by selecting one or more modules. Only students who have taken up 40 credits (8 modules) will be considered for the work placement.
