POSTGRADUATE STUDIES IN ORAL IMPLANTOLOGY

23 ECTS CREDITS - PART-TIME - LANGUAGE: ENGLISH - DEGREE: POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE

COURSE CONTENT

The Postgraduate Studies in Oral Implantology is a 2-year, part-time programme, taught in English. The curriculum is aimed to enable experienced dentists, to start practising implant dentistry

At the end of the programme students should be able to:

- select adequate articles to be able to apply evidence based procedures in the daily practice:
- distinguish between the different implant configurations and different types of implant connections and how to deal with them in relation to the case being treated;
- perform extraction zone management to save the necessary amount of bone;
- deal with the relevant anatomical structures in relation to implant surgery procedures to avoid intra-operative complications;
- recognize indications and contra-indications to place dental implants;
- make a correct presurgical treatment planning and a surgical template using state-of-the-art diagnostic tools;
- perform basic implant surgery in their own clinical practice using aseptic protocols;
- provide their placed dental implants with a temporary and/or definitive restoration;
- deal with more complex cases and be able to manage and coordinate a multidisciplinary treatment approach;
- make treatment planning using guided surgery techniques.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The curriculum amounts to 23 ECTS (European Credits Transfer System) and has an equivalent of 630 study hours. Year one is organised in 5 modules including: 1. introduction, 2. therapy planning and patient selection, 3. surgical procedures, 4. prosthetic procedures, 5. maintenance and advanced implant procedures. Each module is educated in a one week session by a team of experts in the field. Teaching methods include lectures, seminars, computer exercises, preclinical training sessions, hands-on workshops, live surgeries and a cadaver course. Year two focuses on treatment planning and implant surgeries. During this year students have to perform multiple implant cases, under strict one-to-one supervision.

CAREER PERSPECTIVES

The postgraduate studies in oral implantology provide experienced dental professionals with the fundamental competences to start with implant therapy. This includes selection of appropriate cases, treatment planning, perform basic implant surgery, prosthetics and maintenance. After graduation students are equipped to identify and address simple cases and may continue to develop expertise by additional experience and advanced training to address more advanced/complex cases.

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ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL DEGREE STUDENTS

All candidates with permission to practice dentistry in their country of origin and with at least 2 years of clinical experience are considered for enrolment. No specific experience in implant dentistry is required.

Candidates should apply by sending a curriculum vitae, motivation letter and transcript of records of previous education to the course director. After scrutiny of the application documents, the candidate will receive an evaluation (accepted/rejected) or can be invited for an additional personal interview via electronic means.

The number of participants will be limited to 20 in order to be able to give individual support to each of the participants.

LANGUAGE

Proof of proficiency in English (B2) is required at time of registration.
