

POSTGRADUATE STUDIES IN ORAL HEALTH SCIENCES

32 ECTS CREDITS – FULL-TIME – LANGUAGE: ENGLISH – DEGREE: POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE

COURSE CONTENT

The Postgraduate Studies in Oral Health Sciences is a one year full-time programme, indented for international students. The curriculum is taught in English and acts as a preparatory programme for the Advanced Master programme. It is aimed to provide students with the fundamentals of evidenced based dentistry, research methodology including statistics, diagnostics and treatment planning. In addition to theoretical education, students are also trained in a wide range of preclinical skills and observe treatment procedures in multiple specialty clinics. The programme is available with a focus on endodontics, paediatric dentistry, periodontics, orthodontics or reconstructive dentistry.

COURSE STRUCTURE

The curriculum amounts to 32 ECTS (European Credits Transfer System) and has an equivalent of 865 study hours. The programme is structured in general courses (16 ECTS), major specific courses (13 ECTS) and an elective course (3 ECTS) in a topic related to specialised care dentistry. Teaching methods include lectures, computer exercises, case-based learning, preclinical skill training, clinical observations and the preparation of a research paper. The latter is supervised and reports about a topic related to the major of interest.

CAREER PERSPECTIVES

The programme is purposed to provide international students with the fundamentals of evidence based dentistry, research methodology and statistics in combination with the clinical orientated aspects of dentistry focused on endodontics, paediatric dentistry, periodontics, orthodontics or reconstructive dentistry. Furthermore this programme is mandatory as a preparatory year for students seeking admission to the Master in Advanced Dentistry programmes (including endodontics, paediatric dentistry and special care, periodontics, orthodontics or reconstructive dentistry).

Although the Master in Advanced Dentistry curriculum is taught in English, students are also required to obtain a sufficient proficiency in Dutch (B2) in order to communicate with their patients in the dental clinic. The Postgraduate Studies in Oral Health Sciences curriculum enables students to get familiar with the standards and procedures used at the Ghent University dental school and allows students to learn Dutch in preparation for the selection procedure for the Master in Advanced Dentistry Programmes. Completing the Postgraduate Studies in Oral Health Sciences does not automatically grant access to the Advanced Master and doesn't allow graduates to practice dentistry in Belgium.

Candidates should apply by sending a curriculum vitae, a motivational letter and grades on previous education to the course director. After scrutiny of the application, the candidate will receive an evaluation (accepted/rejected) or can be invited for an additional personal interview via electronic means.

Admission to the programme does not imply a working permit within the Health Care System of Belgium. International students should be aware that visa regulations may apply. They should contact the Belgian Embassy or Consulate in their home country for more details.

Proof of proficiency in English (B2) is required at time of registration.
