Position of the course

This (advanced) course seeks to familiarize students with central concepts and issues related to the comparative study of literary texts from various periods, genres, or regions. This course is linked to the aims of the different curricula, particularly those of a bachelor in literature.

Contents

A survey of the central concepts and issues regarding the comparative study of texts in different media (literature, film and comics).

Initial competences

- To be familiar with the terminology of literary theory or other disciplines concerning narrative media.

Final competences

- 1 To have a scientific understanding of the specific characteristics of literary texts and narrative media.
- 2 To be able to implement various methods of analysis for the study of narratives.
- 3 To be able to explain the use of various methods of analysis in a broad historical, social, cultural, and philosophical context.
- 4 To be able to reflect critically upon the connections between texts from various periods, genres, and areas.
- 5 To be able to enter more advanced courses in the Master Comparative Literature and the language-specific masters.
