Position of the course

This course aims to provide the students with a historical framework apt to explain the Italian society, language and culture. This course prepares the students for the courses of Italian linguistics and literature.

This course links in with the core learning outcomes of the Bachelor's Program in Linguistics and Literature, main subject: Italian: B.1.7; B.3.2; B.3.5; B.5.4.

Contents

The course consists of three parts.

The first part provides a general introduction to the Italian geography, political geography and history. Moreover, it will pay attention to some of the most important aspects of contemporary Italian society.

The second part provides an overview of the external history of the Italian language, covering the period going from the first literary texts to the Italian Unification in the 19th century.

The third part acquaints the students with some fundamental aspects of Italian culture.

Initial competences

To have completed the course Italian Language Proficiency I or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 To have an active knowledge of the main lines of Italian history and about some prominent (cultural-) historical figures and phenomena.
- 2 To have an active knowledge of the main aspects of Italy's geography and political geography.
- 3 To have an active knowledge of the main aspects of the Italian society and of some prominent figures and events.

- 4 To have an active knowledge of the main lines of the history of the Italian language.
- 5 To have an active knowledge of the main figures (authors and theoreticians) in the history of the Italian language.
- 6 To have an active knowledge of the key texts in the history of the Italian language.
- 7 To have an active knowledge of some specific Italian cultural concepts.
- 8 To autonomously analyse specific aspects of Italian culture.
- 9 To give proof of intellectual curiosity and commitment to lifelong learning with regard to Italian language, history, society and culture.
- 10 Advanced language proficiency and active language skills in Italian (B1).

Continuous assessment

- Oral exam (3rd part)

End-of-term assessment

- written exam with open questions and multiple choice (1st and 2nd part)

Calculation of the examination mark

Continuous assessment = 6 points (3rd part)

End-of-term assessment = 14 points (8 points for the 1st and 6 for the 2nd part)

Students who fail or do not participate in the full evaluation of both the continuous assessment and the end-of-term assessment can no longer pass the whole course. If the average final score would still be a mark of ten out of twenty or more, this will be reduced to the highest unsuccessful grade (= 9).

In the second examination period the student only has to redo the part (parts) of the exam that he/she did not pass in the first examination period (transfer of pass marks).

Facilities for Working Students

Facilities:

- 1 Class attendance: Absence is allowed provided that a replacement task is submitted (if possible, specify what this task entails)
