Position of the course

This basic course wants to offer insight into the historical developments which have occurred in Europe and its surrounding areas between c. 400 and c. 1500 and to point out the importance of these developments for the course of history until today.

Contents

Survey of the history of Europe and its surrounding areas in the Middle Ages, with special emphasis on the major trends and the most important long-term evolutions. Special attention is paid to the interaction between political, institutional, economic, social, religious and cultural factors and to answering the question how the western Middle Ages, and the confrontation of the West with both the Byzantine Empire and the world of Islam, have contributed to the leading role of Europe in the globalisation of later ages. Every topic takes a recognisable witness of the Middle Ages in the actual town of Ghent as point of departure, in order to deal with this topic from a broader, European perspective. Today's relevance of the Middle Ages also receives attention through discussions based on recent news articles.
