Italian literature; literary analysis; cultural memory; Difficult Pasts; Memory of Fascism, World War II, Colonialism, and the Holocaust.

Position of the course

This specialized course is a continuation of the Bachelor's Program in Italian and offers an in-depth study of specific topics of Italian literary history, cultural history, and cultural memory.

Contents

Advanced course that aims to provide students with knowledge about Italy's Fascist past and the importance that its memory played in the cultural history of the Italian Republic. Through the study of 20th century literary texts (novels and short stories) and scholarly works, the course leads students to address interdisciplinary issues between literature and history, aesthetics and ethics.

Initial competences

This completion course following the bachelor's degree in Italian provides an in-depth study of a specific topic in Italian literature and Italian cultural history. Students have a basic knowledge about Italian 20th century history and excellent command of the Italian language.

Final competences

- 1 To have knowledge of key issues of Italian memory culture about Fascism.
- 2 To be able to formulate critical readings of texts discussed in class.
- 3 To use literature to address and critically engage with some of the darkest pages of 20th century history.
- 4 To develop insights into theories of cultural memory.
- 5 To gain Advanced knowledge of Italian language (B2/C1)
- 6 Writing a book review for a non-specialist audience.

Permanent evaluation: 2 written assessment

Calculation of the examination mark

Continuous assessment: 10 points

- In class written test with multiple choice : 5 point
- Independent writing (1 review piece): 5 points

End-of-term assessment: oral = 10 points

Score calculation language skills and scientific terminology

- Oral Continuous assessment: 25%
- Written Continuous assessment: 25%
- Oral End-of-term assessment: 25%

Students who fail or do not participate in the evaluation of one or more parts of the course can no longer pass for the whole of the course. If the average final score would still be a figure of ten out of twenty or more, this will be reduced to the

highest nonsuccessful digit (= 9).

In the second examination period the student only has to redo the part of the exam that he didn't pass in the first examination period (partial exemption).
