Position of the course

This basic course helps students acquire a basic proficiency in spoken and written Italian. The course also gives students a basic command of grammatical rules.

Contents

Intensive language proficiency with focus on the oral and written proficiency.

Level of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages : A1/A2

- Spelling and pronunciation, the alphabet
- Communication skills
 - o The formal form
 - o Time expression (date/hour)
- Grammar
 - o Indicative: the present tense (*indicativo presente*); the present perfect tense (*indicativo passato prossimo*)
 - o The conditional tense (*condizionale semplice*)
 - o Pronouns: subject pronoun, possessive adjective/pronoun, object pronoun, indirect object pronoun, reflexive pronoun, interrogative pronouns, demonstrative pronouns, stressed and unstressed pronouns (intensive pronoun), pronouns ci/ne.
 - o Numerals: cardinal and ordinal numbers
 - o Prepositions: simple and combined prepositions
 - o Nouns: adjectives and substantives
 - o Plural
 - o Adverbs
 - o Articles: definite and indefinite articles
 - o Modal verbs: *potere, volere, dovere, sapere*
 - o Negation
 - o Word order of affirmative, negative and interrogative clauses

- Vocabulary
- o Common topics: family, living, shopping, school, sports, ...
- o Reading and listening exercises regarding the vocabulary that needs to be studied
- o Writing exercises

- 1 Communication skills: Level of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages : A1 – Understanding/Listening: the student can understand familiar words and very basic phrases concerning himself, his family and immediate concrete surroundings when people speak slowly and clearly.
- 2 Communication skills: Level of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages : A1 – Understanding/Reading: The student can read very short, simple texts. He/she can find specific, predictable information in simple everyday material such as advertisements, prospectuses, menus and timetables and can understand short simple personal letters.
- 3 Communication skills: Level of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages : A1 – Spoken interaction: The student can interact in a simple way provided the other person is prepared to repeat or rephrase things at a slower rate of speech and help him/her formulate what he/she is trying to say. He/she can ask and answer simple questions in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics
- 4 Communication skills: Level of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages : A2 – Spoken production: The student can use a series of phrases and sentences to describe in simple terms his family and other people, living conditions, his educational background and his present or most recent job.
- 5 Application: Level of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages : A2 – Writing: The student can write short, simple notes and messages. He/she can write a very simple personal letter, for example thanking someone for something.
- 6 Application: correct spelling use in writing
- 7 Application: correct pronunciation during spoken production
- 8 Application: correct grammar use in spoken production and writing
- 9 Comprehension of the theory: knowledge and correct reproduction of grammatical terminology
- 10 Comprehension of the theory: knowledge and correct recognition of grammatical concepts
- 11 Comprehension of the theory: knowledge, correct recognition and application of the studied vocabulary, derivatives and semantic fields (a.o. synonyms, antonyms)

- Seminars: weekly sessions ; each week the students are expected to prepare a specific part of the program before the lessons, then practice it during the practice sessions and autonomously.
- Seminars: coached exercises on grammar: weekly sessions on the grammar subjects discussed during the seminars; practice sessions under supervision with oral and written assignments. During the exercises the theoretical knowledge presented in the seminars will be applied.
- Seminars: coached exercises on vocabulary; speaking, reading and listening skills: weekly sessions on the grammar subjects discussed during the seminars; practice sessions under supervision with oral and written assignments. During the exercises the studied vocabulary will be applied.

Extra information on the examination methods

Combination of continuous assessment and end-of-term assessment:

Continuous assessment: exercises (30%)

Final competencies: communication skills (cf. European reference framework); application of spelling, normative grammar, syntax, and vocabulary.

Continuous assessment: oral test (20%)

Final competencies: communication skills (cf. European reference framework); application of pronunciation, normative grammar, syntax, and vocabulary.

End-term assessment: written exam (50%)

Final competencies: communication skills (cf. European frame of reference); listening and understanding; understanding, knowledge, and application of spelling, normative grammar, syntax, and vocabulary.

Second examination period:

In the second examination period, students take only the part of the evaluation for which they did not pass in the first examination period (transfer of passed partial marks).

In the second examination period, the "continuous assessment: exercises (30%)" is replaced by additional exercises/questions during the written exam and the oral test.

Calculation of the examination mark

Continuous assessment: exercises (30%)

Continuous assessment: oral test (20%)

End-term assessment: written exam (50%)

Students who eschew one or more parts of the assessment can no longer obtain a pass mark for the course unit. Should the final mark be higher than 7/20, it will be reduced to the highest non-passable mark (i.e. 7/20).

Students who are legitimately absent on certain days of the practical need to catch up the exercises they missed out on at a different time.

Facilities for Working Students

Possible exemption from attendance with an alternative assignment after consultation with the lecturer-in-charge

Possibility to take the oral examination at a different time in the academic year

Possibility to make an appointment for feedback during and after office hours
