#### Position of the course

This course complements the course "Nordic Literature: Advanced Topics I". While the course "Advanced Topics I" concentrates on text-oriented approaches, this class also focuses on contextual approaches.

# Contents

The course focuses on contextual approaches to studying Nordic literatures. Focal point is the context in which literary texts function.

Toppics within this scope may include: literary-sociological issues, literary historiography and canonizing, reception and mediation of Nordic literatures and issues of translation.

The course is conducted as a seminar discussing relevant texts on contextual research into Nordic literatures.

# Initial competences

Students must have a bachelor in linguistics and literature with Swedish as one of the languages studied.
