## Position of the course

This advanced course will help students gain an understanding into the history of historiography (including recent developments in this area) and in its connection with other social sciences. The course shows how to situate historical studies within society.

## Contents

The course provides an overview of developments in pre modern and modern historiography. The first part of the course offers a comparative analysis of Western, Islamic and Chinese historiography. The second part focuses upon modern Western historiography in the nineteenth and twentieth century. The third part focuses on postmodern historiography in the late twentieth- and early twentyfirst century

## Initial competences

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To have successfully completed the course Historical Criticism or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

#### Final competences

- 1 To have knowledge of evolutions and movements within historiography and of recent debates about this subject.
- 2 To be able to interpret and contextualise historical research and historical acting within society.
