Position of the course

The focus of this course is on text-oriented approaches to a literary study of the Nordic literatures. Students read and discuss fictional and critical texts in one or several Scandinavian languages, deepening their knowledge of text-oriented approaches of literary texts in general and of these approaches with regard to Scandinavian literature in particular.

Contents

In this course Nordic literary texts, especially modern narratives, but also, drama, non-fiction, film and poetry, are read and discussed. Within the text-oriented analysis several aspects may be discussed. Attention can be paid to thematic elements, narratological problems or genre-characteristics. The discussion of the primary texts is supported by and relates to relevant secondary literature of text-oriented research of the Nordic literatures.

The thematic focus of the course is determined by what at the moment is actual in Scandinavian literature and literary research, such as gender and climate change.

Calculation of the examination mark
