Position of the course

In this introductory subject insights are offered into the linguistic aspects of Flemish Sign Language and the Flemish Deaf Community, next to a restricted basic competence in Flemish Sign Language.

Contents

Linguistic aspects of sign languages versus spoken languages, with specific focus on phonological, morphosyntactic, lexical and sociolinguistic aspects of Flemish Sign Language

Initial competences

No requirements concerning prior knowledge of Flemish Sign Language and the Deaf community in Flanders.

Final competences

- 1 Having gained insights in the phonological, morpho-syntactic and lexical structures of sign languages, and especially of Flemish Sign Language.
- 2 Being able to situate Flemish Sign Language in its sociolinguistic context.
- 3 Having gained insight in the most important aspects of Deaf Culture.
- 4 Having gained a basic knowledge of the history and the current structure of the Flemish Deaf Community.
- 5 Having obtained a rather restricted basic competence in Flemish Sign Language.
- 6 Having gained insight in the bilingual acquisition of Flemish Sign Language and Dutch by deaf children and in the communication about this topic towards their parents.
- 7 Having gained insight in the typology of sign languages.
- 8 Digital competence - to explore: to discover (Using digital search environments and search strategies to identify research topics)
- 9 Digital competence - to explore: source criticism (Understanding the way in which the digital turn influences the nature, origin, distribution, (re)use, manipulation and finability of digitalized or born-digital sources)
- 10 Digital competence - to aggregate: to capture (Creating your own digital version of analog or digital research objects by means of audio(visual) or audio recordings, transcription, data recognition or data conversion)
- 11 Digital competence - interpretative modeling: to analyze (Understanding the principles of digital analysis methods and use them to perform analyses (content, network, relational, spatial, structural or stylistic))
- 12 Digital competence - to externalize: collaboration (Using digital methods to collaborate on a project in one or more phases of a research process)
- 13 Digital competence - to reflect: society and ethics (Being aware of the social impact, needs and ethical dimensions of the digital turn and the position of the humanities in it)

Extra information on the examination methods

1. Non-periodic (permanent) evaluation
 - group work (students work in small mixed groups on a chosen theme and process their information gathered in a short paper)
2. Periodic evaluation
 - Oral exam: productive and receptive skills and open questions on grammatical aspects and cultural-historical and sociolinguistic aspects of the Flemish Deaf community.

Calculation of the examination mark

- oral exam (16/20)
- paper (4/20)

Students who do not take part in the assessment of all the parts of the course evaluation cannot pass the course evaluation as a whole. Should the average mark be higher than 10/20, the final mark will be reduced to the highest non-pass mark (= 9/20).

Facilities for Working Students
