Position of the course

(Approved) 1

Through this course, students will acquire elementary active Danish – equivalent to CERF B1 and fluent passive knowledge of Danish – equivalent to CERF B2.

#### Contents

The course focuses on Danish pronunciation, grammar and syntax. Comparison of Danish and Swedish will be the starting point for teaching of elementary vocabulary and grammatical rules. Practical training will consist of grammar exercises, spoken dialogues and shorter written esseys. Texts ranging from short wikipedia texts, to longer newpaper articles to longer popular-scientific texts dealing with etymology, language politics, dialects, language history and language acquisition will be read and discussed in class.

#### Initial competences

A fair passive knowledge of a Scandinavian language, preferably Swedish is required. The level of this knowledge corresponds to Swedish Language Proficiency I.

#### Final competences

- 1 To have elementary active knowledge of Danish equivalent to CERF B1\*
- 2 To have a fluent passive knowledge of Danish equivalent to CERF B2\*\*
- 3 To be able to write a simple text in Danish.
- 4 To be able to read, analyse and contextualise a text in Danish as well as be able to reply to questions raised in Danish.
- 5 To have basic knowledge of the dialectal and sociolectal situation in Denmark.
- 6 To have basic knowledge of the historical linguistic changes that have taken place in the history of the Danish language.
