**Position of the course**

This advanced course helps students to write their BA-thesis in the 3rd year.

**Contents**

The course helps students to choose an apt topic for their thesis, to formulate research questions, to engage independently into research on literary subjects and to report about it. In addition, specific research themes are elaborated in the context of the individual BA-theses. At several points during the term, the students present their research (both orally and in writing) and get feedback from the teachers and their fellow students.

**Initial competences**

To have successfully completed the courses Zweedse letterkunde III & Scandinavische letterkunde or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

**Final competences**

- 1 To be familiar with the most important (electronic) data bases re. literary criticism
- 2 To be able to discuss critical texts in fluent Swedish (C1)
- 3 To be able to apply methods of literary analysis
- 4 To be able to present (orally) in fluent Swedish (C1) one's own research results
- 5 To be able to criticise (orally) in fluent Swedish (C1) the research results of fellow students

Second chance: written assignment.

**Calculation of the examination mark**

1/3 of the final score is based on the presented written material. The other 2/3 are based on the student's contributions to the discussion of the papers.

**Facilities for Working Students**

1. Possible exemption from educational activities requiring student attendance. A task is imposed in substitution after discussion with the lecturer

2. Possible rescheduling of the examination to a different time in the same academic year

3. Alternative time for feedback is possible
