This basic course gives students a historical framework of China and places historical events within this general framework. The course teaches students to understand and explain general tendencies in Chinese history.

**Contents**

This course offers a general overview of the history of China, with special attention to the general evolutions, major historical events and relations with non-Chinese regions. Attention is paid to the visual aspect by means of maps and illustrations.
