Position of the course

This advanced course is aimed at giving the students a basic knowledge of early modern Chinese literature.

Contents

Introduction to the most important authors of the late nineteenth and the early twentieth century, and reading of extracts from their works. This literature is discussed in its historical, and its socio-literary context.

Initial competences

To have successfully completed the courses Modern Chinese III, Modern Chinese IV, Introduction to Modern European Literature (BA 1), and Oriental Literatures: China (BA1), or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 To know the most important authors of the early modern period;
- 2 To be able to read early modern Chinese literature;
- 3 To have a passive knowledge of the literary language used in the early modern period, with emphasis on the influence of Western literature on early modern Chinese literature;
- 4 To understand the importance of the early modern period in Chinese literature in the Chinese literary history;
- 5 To be able to situate early modern Chinese literature in its socio-literary context.
