**Position of the course**

This advanced course is part of the package 'Practica'; the main aim is to confront the student with the practices of archaeology, more specifically with fieldwork.

**Contents**

The students will have to search for one or more on-going professional excavation (or survey) projects (preferably in Belgium). After approval by staff members they are expected to participate in the fieldwork (actual excavation, determination of archaeological features, registration, drawing etc.). Minimum 15 days.

**Initial competences**

- To have successfully completed the course package Methodology or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

**Final competences**

- 1 To participate actively during an excavation.
- 2 To have insight into the chronology of fieldwork (preliminary research, actual excavation).
- 3 To have knowledge of the principles of field work.
- 4 To be able to apply the basic registration methods in the field.
- 5 To be able to produce a critical and thorough fieldwork report.
