### Position of the course

This in-depth course is part of a package called Practice, which is intended to confront the student with the practice of archaeology, more specifically with field practice.

### Contents

An excursion of about a week is organised abroad. The organisation is supervised by a lecturer, but in practice it is carried out by the students, who have to keep both the practical and scientific aspects in mind. Students have to research the archaeology of the region visited and prepare an extensive paper around it. In smaller groups, the students have to prepare the visit of the various sites, based on archaeological professional literature. The same group will then take on the tour of the site.

### Initial competences

Successful completion of the Ba2 standard route or acquisition of the competences it aims to provide in another way.

### Final competences

- 1 Contacted the archaeology of (part of) another (European) country.
- 2 To be able to draw up correct scientific dossiers on the archaeology of this region, using archaeological literature.
- 3 Being able to organise a proper scientific presentation at the archaeological sites.
- 4 Working in team.
- 5 Be able to give a clear oral presentation at an archaeological site.-

## Extra information on the teaching methods

Fieldwork: a week visiting sites, museums and archaeological institutions abroad, the practical aspects and the scientific guidance will be carried out by the students.

Group work: small groups of students will plan and execute the fieldwork.

Assignment: individual written report of the fieldwork

No oral exam is provided, but rather a thorough archaeological report before and after the trip on the various sites and attractions, which the students prepare, organize and present in small groups. A forum is provided for this purpose at UFORA, which is also monitored by the tutors.

A regular meeting between tutors and students is also part of the overall evaluation of the trip.

In the field itself, students will be further assessed for knowledge of what is presented.

## Calculation of the examination mark

Non-periodical: continuous assessment (100%)

50% workpiece; 50% presentation

Participation is evaluated by the teacher and can lead to a correction of the final mark with 0, +1 or -1/20
