Position of the course

Advanced course. The aim of this course is to provide students with insight into the development of rural communities in Europe from the Middle Ages to the early nineteenth century.

Contents

- The course 'Comparative Rural History' deal s systematically with the
 development and dynamics of the European countryside from a comparative and
 long-term perspective. It is broadly European: from the Iberian Peninsula to
 Eastern Europe and from Scandinavia to the Mediterranean. Chronologically, this
 course unit covers the period prior to the Black Death to the Industrial Revolution
 (c. 1250/1300 to c. 1750/1800.
- This course focuses on the divergent developments within European rural
 communities, their causes and most important consequences. The lectures cover
 the following aspects per region: population structures and development,
 property and power relations, business structures, production and trade, social
 relations, prosperity and poverty, political relations, economic development and
 inequality.
