**Position of the course**

This advanced course unit wants to enable students to perform research concerning the Early Modern Period.

**Contents**

- A survey of the administrative, ecclesiastical and judicial structures and sources of the 16th-18th centuries, with focus on the Netherlands.
- A survey of bibliographical devices and sources (unpublished and published), in printed form as well as on line.
- A survey of scientific libraries and archival institutions in Belgium and abroad relevant for the study of the Early Modern Period.
- Search strategies in light of the research objectives.
- Analysis of some specific source types.

**Initial competences**

Have successfully completed the course "Introduction to Historical Research" and a "Historical Practice I" class, or their equivalent. For Erasmus students, or students who want to follow this course as a preparatory course, the lecturer is able to ascertain that they have acquired the requisite skills in another manner.

**Final competences**

- 2 Be able to initiate question directed historical research.

- 4 Have the ability to indicate the most appropriate types of sources relative to a specific historical research question.
- 5 Have the ability to contextualize historical research and one's own actions, and interpret them within a societal reference framework.
- 6 Have an inquiring attitude with a love of historical critique and creativity, and

- with a positive attitude towards lifelong learning.
- 7 Have insight into the way in which historical scientific research works and is organized.
  - 8 Have insight into how related human and social sciences work.
  - 9 Have an insight into how archives are organized.
