In the final stage of the transition program, the student is required to demonstrate his academic skills by writing a research paper of about 10,000 words: presentation and analysis of academic literature in international languages; basic knowledge of current literary and linguistic theories; writing skills. Students are also required to attend a research seminar related to the topic of the paper (linguistics or literature of a particular language, or general literature). Students who work on a topic related to Classical Languages (linguistics or literature) attend the seminar of Classical Languages.
