Position of the course

The aim of this advanced course is to help students conceptualize and write an academic essay within the field of Italian literature. This course also provides students with a command of the academic use of the Italian language. The course prepares students to write the Bachelor and Master theses in the field of Italian Literature.

Contents

This seminar concentrates on specific methods and research topics that are dealt with in the preparation of individual research papers. In the course of the seminar, students report on their research and receive feedback from the teacher.

This course deals with the followings topics and skills:

- 1 Structure and index of a research paper
- 2 Bibliographical research: gathering scholarly sources
- 3 Quoting or paraphrasing primary and secondary sources
- 4 Bibliographic references and bibliography
- 5 Formulating a research question
- 6 Formulating a status quaestionis
- 7 Editing of the text and footnotes
- 8 Writing techniques for different text types
- 9 Command of the Italian language: correct use of the Italian language (grammar and vocabulary) and adequate use of scientific terminology

Initial competences

Successful completion of the courses Italian Literature I, Italian literature II, Italian literature III and Italian language proficiency III or acquisition of the required knowledge and skills by other means.

- 3 papers: part of the research paper.
- Participation during the lessons.
- The written exercises will focus on the research topics of the research papers.
- The bachelor paper is formally independent from this seminar and will be assessed separately from the course.
- Language proficiency
 - Correct use of the literary terminology
 - Correct use of the Italian language (grammar and vocabulary, level B2/C1)

Calculation of the examination mark

Continuous assessment (100%)

- First paper (bibliography): 6 points
- Second paper (status quaestionis): 8 points
- Third paper (research question + table of contents): 6 points

Assessment language proficiency: 40% of each evaluation.

Students who fail or do not participate in the full evaluation of both the continuous assessment and the end-of-term assessment can no longer pass the whole course.

If the average final score would still be a mark of ten out of twenty or more, this will be reduced to the highest unsuccessful grade (= 9).

In the second examination period the student only has to redo the part (parts) of the exam that he/she did not pass (or participate) in the first examination period (transfer of pass marks).

Facilities for Working Students

Facilities:

- 1 Class attendance: Absence is allowed provided that a replacement task is submitted (if possible, specify what this task entails)
- 2 Online facilities: No online/digital facilities (lectures take place on campus, without recordings)
- 3 Catch-up exam: It is possible to take the exam at a different time within the regular exam period
