Position of the course

This advanced course is a general course unit within the Master of Archaeology. It builds on the competences acquired in the bachelor's degree in archaeology.

Contents

The student must actively participate in archaeological fieldwork (surface excavation, trial trenching, drilling, prospecting, geophysical research, etc.) for a period of at least three weeks (= 15 working days) and report on this.

These activities may be organised by the Department of Archaeology, but the student may also, with the approval of those responsible, participate in an activity organised by another institution, foreign or otherwise. The purpose of this third internship is to offer the student the opportunity to see other methods and techniques working and using.

The internship report must be a scientific reflection of the student's own experiences at the internship. This experience should be placed in the course of the entire archaeological research. The student must demonstrate insight into the practice and organisation of archaeological research and must be able to formulate an efficient and critical report of the research. In addition, the student is expected to be able to situate the excavation or internship research in a broader context, both in terms of period and region. The internship report must be

supported by a thorough literature study.

The language of this course is Dutch, but some activities can be done in another language, depending on the internship.

Initial competences

This course builds on certain final competencies of the bachelor's programme in archaeology.

At the very least passive knowledge of English and French to be able to consult professional literature.

Final competences

- 1 To use interpretative insights when analysing complex problems (e.g. stratigraphical problems, spatial analyses, etc) and in the field of archaeological management.
- 2 To react to the changing relations between research practices and the institutional and legal context of the archaeological practices and to be able to deliver policy suggestions.
- 3 To apply human and natural sciences in research or in professional activities (multidisciplinarity).
- 4 To apply methods and techniques in an autonomous way and to collect, document, analyse and process scientific archaeological remains.
- 5 To apply the best research methods to professional archaeological activities or study.
- 6 To critically apply international, archaeological and scientific literature in an original and substantiated manner.
- 7 To act with integrity, to demonstrate a scientific (archaeological) curiosity, to have a critical mind and to display a commitment to lifelong learning.
- 8 To write a high-quality document about one's own archaeological research.
- 9 To communicate, collaborate and act in an appropriate, inspiring, advisory and authoritative manner.
- 10 To contribute to archaeological heritage management, collection policy and fieldwork in the broadest sense of the world, and this in a deontological and justified manner.
- 11 To function in the changing professional environment of archaeology and to react to this environment in a deontological and correct manner.
- 12 To conduct archaeological fieldwork (prospection, excavation) and/or the study of material.
