Position of the course

This course is a continuation of the course "Introduction to archival science" (A005090), and seeks to demonstrate the practical application of the theoretical knowledge acquired in "Introduction to archival science".

Contents

Students do a 120-hour internship at an archival institution, where they are supervised by an internship supervisor, with the aim of:

- Learning and applying a number of practical archival skills, such as the drafting of archival work plans and the inventorization of archives to improve their accessibility.
- Becoming familiar with archival institutions & management.

Initial competences

Successful completion of two "Heuristics" courses and two "Historical Practice II" courses, or their equivalent. For Erasmus students, or students who wish to follow this course as part of a linking or preparatory program, it is permissible to determine whether they have acquired the requisite skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 To have insight into the epistemology and academic practice of historiography.
- 2 To have the ability to indicate the most appropriate types of sources relative to a specific historical research question.
- 3 To have the ability to contextualize historical research and one's own historical practice, and interpret these within a societal reference frame.
- 4 To have insight into the place of history and historians in society.
- 5 To have insight into how archives and heritage institutions work.
