Position of the course

In this advanced course the student is required to show competence in the goals as set for the MA-curriculum (final competences), this in order to put a capstone on his/her MA studies.

These goals include:

- 2. being able to carry out research on an independent basis,
- $\ensuremath{\mathtt{3}}.$ apply research methods and techniques in an advanced setting,
- 4. being able to report about research results in a sophisticated and well-argued manner.

The result is an extended essay, which is evaluated by the supervisor and other referees. The candidate is also required to present the research results during an oral presentation.
