Position of the course

Being able to, basing oneself on an analysis of the information given in Chinese written, spoken, and digital media and in such media in the Chinese language, independently evaluate economic, political and social problems that occur in contemporary China. Being able to report on one's analysis both orally and in written form.

Exchange students may take up this course unit, for which no prior knowledge of Dutch is required.

Contents

This course builds on the Chinese information and information in the Chinese language given in written, spoken, and digital media on contemporary problems in China. The students have to choose two themes themselves, and have to gather information on these themes in the written, spoken, and digital media. Based on these sources, they have to report in Chinese in oral and in written (4000 Chinese characters) form on their research and findings. The topics chosen by the students are also discussed in class.

Initial competences

'Modern Chinese: China in the Media' requires a profound knowledge of Modern Chinese (level BA3) and a basic level of Classical Chinese (BA2). Also knowledge of 'Methods and Research: South and East Asia 2', 'East-Asian Philosophies' and 'Society and Contemporary Issues: China' is required.

Final competences

- 1 Being able to derive the relevant information from reports in written, spoken, and digital Chinese and Chinese-language media;
- 2 Being able to link Chinese and Chinese-language media reports to scientific findings as they are known through scientific literature;
- 3 Being able to explain problems in contemporary China in their historical perspective;

- 4 Being able to give an oral report on one's findings in Chinese;
- 5 Being able to report in written Chinese on one's findings.
- 6 Being able to interpret and contextualize digital media.

During the seminars, students have to report on two chosen topics (politics, economics, society) to their fellow students. These topics are also discussed in class. In seminars, a relevant research question on the topic is formulated. This research question has to be further elaborated, using further reports in the media. In the course of the semester, a written report on each of the two topics has to be handed in.

Extra information on the examination methods

Continuous (50 %) and End-of-the term (50 %) assessment.

Continous assessment:

- During the semester, the students need to develop two case studies. They have to give two oral presentations and write one paper on each of the case studies. The quality of their research work and of the oral and written report determine the result.

End-of-the-term assessment:

- The examination consists of an extensive written (6000 Chinese characters) and oral report on one of the two topics chosen during the semester.

Calculation of the examination mark

50 % continuous assessment (50 % evaluation of the oral reports; 50 % on the written papers).

50 % end-of-term assessment (50 % evaluation on oral presentation; 50 % on the written report)

Students have to pass for both the part evaluation of the oral reports (50 %) and for the written papers (50 %), as well as for the whole of the continuous and end-of-term assessment. If a student does not pass for one of both or for both parts, a retake of the oral and the written presentations in the second examination period is required.

Students who do not take part in the assessment of one or more parts of the course evaluation or obtain a mark of less than 10/20 for one of its parts cannot pass the course evaluation. Should the average mark be higher than 10/20, the final mark will be reduced to the highest non-pass mark (=9).
