### Position of the course

This course is part of Think & Talk, the interfaculty honours programme of the faculties Arts and Philosophy, Law and Criminology, Economics and Business Administration, Psychology and Educational Sciences, and Political and Social Sciences. In a series of debates the students are introduced to perspectives from other disciplines, and they meet experts as well as fellow students from the five abovementioned faculties.

### Contents

The course consists of two workshops ('participating in a debate' and 'organizing a debate'), an opening debate, a series of five debate evenings and a creative closing session in which students present the result of their work for the Think & Talk honours programme. The student group organizes the five debate evenings on topics and questions relevant to the contemporary humanities and social sciences, under the guidance of experts from various disciplines and from the five participating faculties.
