**Position of the course**

This course offers in-depth insight into literary research at the intersection with Digital Humanities. Taught in close collaboration with GhentCDH (Ghent Centre for Digital Humanities), the course familiarises students with important theoretical developments in digital literary studies. Through practical training, students are also introduced to some of the most recent and innovative methods in Digital Humanities. Finally, they apply these methods to a case study which they conduct individually as well as in group.

**Contents**

This course is part of the interuniversity Master in literary studies coordinated by KU Leuven. The specific course content varies according to recent developments in the field and is announced in the programme brochure at the beginning of the academic year.

**Initial competences**

Participants hold a Master's degree in Language and Literature or have successfully completed a comparable Master's programme with a sufficiently strong literary component.

**Final competences**

- 1 Applying digital methods to literary research.
- 2 Combining traditional and digital literary research methods and integrating them into a small-scale case study.
- 3 Giving constructive feedback on the work of fellow students and on the digital methods taught in class.
