Position of the course

This advanced course aims at helping students with the acquirement of insight in the musical developments during the twentieth century in the context of broad ideological, political and cultural developments.

Contents

Music history from 1910 to the beginning of the 21st century in Europe and America. The course gives an overview of the relevant stylistic and technical developments and their relationship to broad cultural trends. Attention is given in particular to the connections between music and the political and ideological history of the twentieth century. The material is mainly presented chronologically, with a focus on specific topics, such as music and modernism, music and politics, opera and music theatre, electronic music, and the history of jazz.

Initial competences

No special competences are required to start the course.

Final competences

1 The development of auditory memory through a test in which musical fragments should be

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- recognized upon listening.
- 2 Knowledge of music historical developments and their relation to general and cultural history.
- 3 The development of an aesthetic frame of reference concerning the music of the twentieth century
- 4 Knowledge of music historical terminology.
- 5 Insight in historical processes and the methodology of research in cultural history.
