Position of the course

In the research task the student must prove that he/she is capable to conduct independent scientific research, is able to reflect critically, and can situate the research topic within a broader context.

The BA dissertation is a year-course, which means that the student must start with the work during the first semester. For students who opt for the Africa-track during the first semester, this thus further implies that they will need to have both a topic and a UGent supervisor before they leave for the field!

Contents

The student writes a paper of the genre 'scientific article', in Dutch or English, and between **7,000** and **12,500** words long, including footnotes and the references (but excluding addenda).

Initial competences

Having gained sufficient critical reflection in previous years of study.

Final competences

- 1 Being able to independently formulate a research question.
- 2 Being able to reach the answer to that research question independently and in a scientific manner.
- 3 Being able to reflect critically about a research topic.
- 4 Being able to frame a research question in a wider context.
- 5 Being able to delimit and process the scientific literature of a certain field.
- 6 Being able to use generative AI (which is allowed and encouraged), being fully aware of the ethical and deontological implications.
