### Position of the course

This specialized course helps students broaden their views on linguistics or literary studies and deepen their practical experience in one of these disciplines. The student chooses a research topic and defines an initial research question, on the basis of which s/he chooses a tutor within the faculty or university to prepare a research project in linguistics or literary studies. The research project pertains to the discipline of the master's thesis, either linguistics or literary studies. The tutor can be the promoter or co-promoter of the master's thesis, but also another colleague who has relevant expertise with regard to the research project. Every employee of the university with a teaching qualification is eligible as a tutor, both within and outside the student's own faculty.

### Contents

After consulting with the tutor, the student compiles a program for five credits. The research project may be an extension of the research conducted for the master's thesis, but this is not a requirement. The program consists of two parts:

- (1) A fully elaborated draft of a research project, written in English, that the student must prepare according to the usual guidelines of a project application at a funding institution such as the FWO, i.e. with information about: the research context, the research question(s), theoretical embedding and methodology, possible hypotheses, a work plan, the intended / expected results, supervision and guidance, possible study stays abroad, etc.;
- (2) A portfolio that reports on the student's research activities. These activities can include reading assignments, attending presentations, lectures, a summer / autumn school, participating in a conference or workshop, giving a presentation, participating in an ongoing research project, following a MOOC, etc. The student also participates as much as possible in the research activities in the tutor's research group. The student participates in discussions within the group that concern the research of the members of the group, the planning of research activities, discussions, internal presentations, project applications, the preparation of abstracts and conference participation, the preparation of scientific publications, etc.
- (3) A final interview with the tutor to conclude the program in which the portfolio, the draft of the research project and the progress in research practice in the tutor's research group are discussed.

The course offers a lot of freedom to the student and the tutor and strongly appeals to the student's sense of responsibility. In this way, the course aims at preparing the student for the position s/he takes after her/his education in society, in which specific attitudes and skills such as independence, entrepreneurial spirit, a critical mindset, creativity, flexibility, assertiveness and responsibility for the completion of projects are highly valued. The program must meet the preparatory professional and/or research-oriented conditions that apply at Master's level. Any research project proposal must be submitted to the coordinator for approval, who will then inform the "Opleidingscommissie" or its representative. In case specific problems arise, the coordinator consults with the tutor; the "Opleidingscommissie" or its representative will also be informed accordingly.

With regard to compiling the individual program, the student's attention is drawn to the various activities organized by the different research groups at Ghent University, both inside and outside the faculty. It should be taken into account that the student must have the necessary prior knowledge if s/he chooses a different research group as host than the research groups s/he knows from her/his own study program (e.g. a research group from another study program

in the faculty or outside the faculty). Any choice of research group should be discussed in advance with the coordinator, who also consults with the intended tutor if necessary.

### **Initial competences**

Meet the admission requirements for the Master "Taal- en Letterkunde" (Language and Literature).

### **Final competences**

1. Prepare a research application in accordance with current requirements and cooperate in a team of researchers with regard to specific objectives developed in a research project
2. Putting scientific knowledge and skills based on practice, reading, participation in conferences/workshops, etc. at the service of a well thought-out, innovative research project in linguistics or literary study and reporting on this in a portfolio
3. Explain the research questions, objectives and results of an individual research project in an interview and demonstrate one's own contributions to research practice

### **Teaching methods**

Guided self-study, integration seminar, research project

### **Learning materials and price**

The final assessment is based on three components:

- the draft of a research project (written in English) that the student must draw up in accordance with the usual guidelines of a project application at a funding institution such as the FWO-Flanders (i.e. with information about the research context, the research question(s), theoretical framework and methodology, possible hypotheses, a work plan, the intended/expected results, supervision and guidance, possible study stays abroad, etc.);
- the portfolio;
- a final interview with the tutor to conclude the program in which the portfolio, the draft of the research project and the progress in research practice in the tutor's research group are discussed.

### **Calculation of the examination mark**

100% continuous assessment:

- portfolio and final interview with the tutor: 50%;
- draft of the research project: 50%.

Unfounded absence or non-participation regarding one of the components of the evaluation leads to a final score of max. 9/20. The same evaluation methods are used in the second examination period.
