Position of the course

In this advanced subject the student is asked to demonstrate his/her mastery of a selection of final curricular competencies by writing a Master's Dissertation of approximately 20.000 words (excluding the bibliography) to complete his/her MA studies. Those competencies include being able to think and act in a scientific way, being able to apply research methods and techniques in an advanced setting, and being able to report about one's own research to the profession.

Contents

Initial competences

Having successfully completed the bachelor research paper or having acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 Advanced comprehension of and insight into the scientific knowledge related to the discipline in general and to the main subject in particular.

Extra information on the examination methods

At the end of the exam period, an oral defense of the master's thesis takes place. This defense lasts 20 minutes and consists of two parts:

- (1) The student presents an infographic in which he/she explains the subject and importance of the master's thesis to a lay audience, in the language of the master's thesis.
- (2) Discussion between the evaluators and the student on various aspects of the master's thesis.

In principle, the interview takes place in the language of the master's thesis. Students can submit an application to hold the evaluation interview in another language (OER, art. 59, §1,5).

Calculation of the examination mark

80% non-periodical: evaluation of the paper by two assessors, viz. the supervisor and one other referent with complementary expertise. The exam committee decides on the final score on the basis of the marks of the two assessors. In case of *several* supervisors, i.e. a main supervisor plus one or more co-supervisors, the co-supervisor(s) are added to the jury and give a mark as well. The added marks of the supervisor and co-supervisor(s) have the same weight as the mark of the other referent.

20% periodical: evaluation of the oral defense by the two assessors. The exam committee decides on the final score on the basis of the marks of all assessors present. In case of several supervisors, it is again the case that the added marks of the supervisor and co-supervisor(s) have the same weight as the mark of the other referent.

Participation in the oral defense is mandatory. Students who do not participate in the oral defense cannot receive a final mark higher than 9/20.

Students have to succeed for the thesis (non-periodical evaluation) in order to succeed for this course.
