**Teaching languages**

**Position of the course**

This course aims at providing a (passive) knowledge of Old Slavonic, the common written language of the Orthodox Slav world, through the study of the elementary grammar and the reading of adapted texts.

**Contents**

The elementary grammar (phonetics and phonology, morphology and syntax) is acquired by means of a syllabus. Since only a passive knowledge of the language is aimed at, the theory is almost immediately put into practice by reading texts in 'standardized' Old Church Slavonic. Only the oldest texts are eligible (as Old Church Slavonic splits into regional variants later on).

**Initial competences**

No previous knowledge required

**Final competences**

- 1 knowledge of the historico-cultural context of the origin and the development of Old Slavonic
- 2 knowledge of the grammar of Old Slavonic
- 3 the ability to grammatically parse a normalized Old Slavonic text
- 4 the ability to translate a normalized Old Slavonic text
