Position of the course

This advanced course wants to provide a thorough knowledge of Portuguese, an introduction to non-European language varieties and further acquaintance with the Portuguese-speaking culture.

Exchange students may take this course. It does not require knowledge of Dutch.

Contents

This course aims to improve the active knowledge of the Portuguese grammar and lexicon, as well as the language proficiency through exercises on listening, reading and speaking. All of this is situated in the cultural context of Portugal and the Portuguese-speaking countries. Envisaged level of language proficiency: B2.

Initial competences

To have successfully completed Portuguese I or have acquired the necessary skills by other means. Expected level of language proficiency at the start of the course: A2/B1.

Final competences

- 1 To actively command the normative grammar, a.o. the use of tenses and moods in context and pronouns.
- 2 To have the necessary lexical knowledge to express oneself correctly in Portuguese (both orally and in written form) in everyday contexts.
- 3 To be able to follow the Portuguese courses of the (Iberico-Romance) Master (linguistics and literature) and to be able to successfully follow a study programme at a Portuguese university.
- 4 To be able to read simple contemporary literary texts in Portuguese.
- 5 To be acquainted with specific cultural elements of the Portuguese speaking societies.

Extra information on the examination methods

PE: Written exam: grammar and vocabulary; reading skills of a new text; writing of a small text.

PE: Oral exam: (1) small talk conversation, (2) oral interaction about a non-prepared topic, (3) presentation of a prepared topic (with GenAI allowed).

NPE: continuous assessment (20%), comprising a test on grammar and vocabulary; writing, listening and/or reading (15%); group presentation (5%).

NPE: compulsory presence during classes (5%).

Students who do not take part in the assessment of one or more parts of the course evaluation cannot pass the course. Should the average mark be higher than 10/20, the final mark will be reduced to the highest non-pass mark (= 9).

During evaluation a correction key is used which is attuned for the Portuguese language proficiency courses.

Calculation of the examination mark

75% periodical evaluation, 25% non-periodical.

- Periodical evaluation: written exam (60%) and oral exam (15%).
- Non-periodical evaluation: intermediary test (15%), presentation (5%), presence (5%).

- 2 Possible rescheduling of an oral and written examination to a different time in the same academic year.
