Position of the course

This course introduces advanced students to historical and theoretical tools for analyzing and contextualizing different kinds of comics (strips, periodicals, graphic novels, digital comics), with a special focus on graphic novels and comics magazines.

Contents

The graphic novel has become a staple of the literary scene. It also continues to mystify: is it a work of literature, of visual art? Is it a novel or an art book? What is the difference between comics and graphic novels? Understanding comics as a medium - graphic novels, albums, comic strips, and digital comics as different manifestations of the medium - this course seeks to examine comics in all their diversity.

The course hence

- interrogates the polarities of popular, genre fiction and literary fiction
- investigates the differences between literary and cultural products for children and adults and the grey areas where they overlap
- reflects on the relation between materiality and mediality, and what it implied in the evolution of comics formats
- equips students with historical and theoretical tools for analyzing different kinds of comics (strips, periodicals, graphic novels, digital comics)
- comprises an individual research project developed by the students. Passive knowledge of French is an advantage.

Initial competences

Proof of conducting small research projects and writing research papers (ability to formulate research questions and hypotheses, select and apply appropriate methodologies, distill and evaluate results) through, for instance, a BA paper or another research paper of at least 8.000 words.

Final competences

1 Acquire insight into comics histories and methodologies from comics studies, image analysis and periodical studies for reading different kinds of comics

(graphic novels, comics magazines).

- 2 Design and conduct a comics-related research project by selecting, combining and applying relevant methodologies for the study of comics
- 3 Incorporate feedback on different stages of the project (research question and methodology, preliminary analysis, results and their presentation)
- 4 Give feedback to peers on different stages of the project
- 5 Effectively communicate results through different academic formats (a brief scholarly text, a presentation, a poster and a final paper)

Calculation of the examination mark

- 4 Final paper: 45%

To pass the course, students need a grade of at least 9.5/20 on their final paper. In case of resit, students will have to retake only the component they failed (only applies within the same academic year).
