Students are introduced to issues in research ethics and scientific integrity.

Initial competences

- 2 Insight into the relevant issues in research ethics and scientific integrity.
- 3 Ability to develop a philosophical research project and draw up a funding application that can be filed with institutions like the FWO and the Special Research Funds of universities (and similar foreign institutions).
