**Position of the course**

This course is one of the research seminars that constitute the core of the master programme. Depending on initial qualifications, students enroll for three or five such research seminars.

**Contents**

Immanuel Kant's thinking and the philosophers influenced by him underlie this research seminar. We focus primarily (but not exclusively) on Kant's philosophy, 19<sup>th</sup>-century German philosophy, neo-Kantianism and other philosophers inspired by Kant. Based on the lecturers' rich expertise, the students learn how to make a sound, well-founded and constructive contribution to research on Kant and post-Kantian philosophy.

**Initial competences**
