Position of the course

“Russian Language Practice II” (R1PII) aims to enable students to:

- improve pronunciation and intonation;
- increase their speaking and reading tempo;
- expand basic vocabulary;
- apply grammar rules in practice;
- produce oral and written texts;
- understand oral and written texts.

The study unit “Russian : Language Practice II” (R1PII) builds upon skills acquired in the study unit “Russian : Language Practice I” (R1PI) and applies knowledge and insights acquired in the study units “Russian : Grammar I” (R1GI) and “Russian : Grammar II” (R1GII).

Contents

The study unit “Russian Language Practice II” consists of the following sub-units:

- Writing skills (R1PII_SC)
- Speaking skills (R1PII_SP)

R1PII_SC: The students' vocabulary is significantly expanded on the basis of vocabulary themes. Certain aspects of grammar are practised through written exercises. Attention is also paid to text analysis, elementary translation of Russian into Dutch and text production skills.

R1PII_SP: "Speaking skills" is closely tied to "Writing skills", using the same vocabulary themes. Students acquire the new vocabulary and grammar introduced in "Writing skills" through oral practice, translating dialogues from Dutch into Russian and summarizing texts. Emphasis is placed on the correct use of verb tenses, verb aspect and numerals and students are taught to tell the time and give dates.

Initial competences

Average general knowledge that can be expected from someone who has completed secondary education; no specific starting competences required.

Final competences

- 1 Having a command of Russian at B1 level of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages for reading [B.1.2. ; not assessed] and at A2 level for speaking, writing and listening. [B.1.2. ; assessed], (in as far as the competences of R1GI, R1GII, R1PI have also been acquired).
- 2 Having a basic knowledge of the general vocabulary of Russian. [B.1.2. ; assessed]

- 4 Having a command of the basic grammar of Russian in the areas of morphology of verbs, adjectives, nouns and pronouns and of the basic use of cases. [B.1.2. ; assessed]
- 5 Using the knowledge acquired in the areas of morphology of verbs, adjectives, nouns and pronouns and case use in the production of oral and written texts. [B.1.2. ; assessed]
- 6 Using the knowledge acquired in the areas of morphology of verbs, adjectives, nouns and pronouns and case use in understanding oral and written texts. [B.1.2. ; assessed]
