Position of the course

This basic training component has a theoretical and a practical component. During the theoretical lessons, students are introduced to Spanish grammar and its use, focusing on morphology, word types, verb tenses and syntactic analysis of the singular sentence. In the practical component, the four skills are developed through a communicative approach and grammar is further practised. Students acquire the basic vocabulary of Spanish (productive level A2, receptive level B1). Level European Reference Framework: A2.

Contents

This course covers the following aspects of the language:

- * Pronunciation and spelling
- * Grammar: the use of pronouns; morphology of the verb and noun; the use of tenses; syntactic analysis of the simple sentence
- * Basic vocabulary
- * Listening skills
- * Speaking skills
- * Reading skills
- * Writing skills

- 1 Mastery of basic Spanish grammar: formation of substantives and adjectives, conjugation of verbs, use of past tenses, use of determiners, formation and use of pronouns.
- 2 Mastery of basic grammar terminology.
- 3 Be able to analyse a sentence into word types and syntactic functions.
- 4 Using a correct pronunciation of Spanish.
- 5 Proficiency in Spanish, at ECC level A2 for reading, writing, speaking and listening.
- 6 Possess a good knowledge of the general vocabulary of Spanish.

The continuous assessment takes place during the lectures and the tutorials. The dates will be announced at the start of the academic year but can still be adjusted if it proves convenient. Attendance is mandatory.

This course includes compulsory digital exercises. Students must complete at least 80% of these exercises by the predetermined deadline, otherwise 1 point out of 20 will be deducted.

Based on period and non-period evaluation, scores are calculated for three components: grammar, vocabulary and skills. For the grammar and vocabulary components, students must score at least 8.5/20 to pass the course. Otherwise, the overall score will be reduced to max 9/20. If this happens, it is possible to get a partial exemption for the passed parts for the second term. In all other cases, an unsuccessful student must retake all parts.

Facilities for Working Students

- 2 Possible rescheduling of an oral and written examination to a different time in the same academic year
- 3 Individual feedback can be given.
