Position of the course

This course aims to provide the students with a historical framework apt to explain the Italian society, language and culture.

Contents

The course consists of two parts.

The first part provides a general introduction to the Italian geography, history, society, economy, political geography. Moreover, some of the most important aspects of contemporary Italian society will be discussed.

The second part provides an overview of the external history of the Italian language, covering the period going from the first literary texts to the Italian Unification in the 19th century.
