Position of the course

This introductory subject helps students acquire ready language skills in Italian. All language skills are practised. Here, students learn to apply the basic structures of Italian (as seen in the course Italian: Language Skills I). Exchange students with B1 (or higher) level in Dutch may take this course.

Contents

This subject aims to expand vocabulary on everyday topics, e.g. family, home, shopping, school, health, sports. It involves intensive work on writing skills and vocabulary expansion, e.g. through short translation exercises, where contrastive aspects are revealed. Listening comprehension exercises are also covered systematically. Italian pronunciation rules are also learned and practised in this subject. Interactive exercises are systematically organised in the lessons.

- 1 Mastering Italian, at CEFR level A2+ for listening, writing and vocabulary.
- 2 Recognise and interpret grammatical structures of Italian, paying specific attention to the analysis of word types, lexical structures, simple sentence, compound sentence and paying attention to contrastive aspects with respect to Dutch.
- 3 Independently edit simple texts dealing with areas of direct personal interest.
- 4 Handle correct pronunciation of Italian.
- 5 Have knowledge regarding the cultural-historical and institutional context of the language area.
