Position of the course

This course unit aims to teach students to express themselves correctly in the Italian language at an intermediate level, both orally and in writing. The course prepares students to take second-year subjects. Exchange students may take this course.

Contents

This course unit aims to expand active and passive vocabulary significantly; students learn to converse fluently in Italian on topics of immediate personal interest and on texts discussed in class, paying attention to intonation and pronunciation; students learn to interpret Italian texts of low-medium difficulty and to translate short sentences from Italian to Dutch and vice versa. Some advanced structures of Italian are also covered here.

Initial competences

The final competences of the different course units Italian of the first semester.

Final competences

- 1 Proficiency in Italian, at CEFR level B1 for reading, speaking (production/interaction) and vocabulary, insofar as the competences of Italian: proficiency I and Italian: proficiency II are also acquired.
- 2 Pronounce Italian correctly.
- 3 Master some elements of the basic grammar of Italian (especially with regard to the subfields of morphology/syntax of the verb and pronouns).
- 4 Take into account intercultural relations and differences when interpreting and producing in the foreign language.
- 5 Demonstrate intellectual curiosity and an attitude of lifelong learning.
- 6 From the acquired competences, act correctly and tactfully in various communicative situations, relying on an understanding of similarities, differences and interactions between cultures.
