Position of the course

This advanced course aims at a thorough knowledge of the grammar, a further enrichment of the vocabulary and a solid command of French oral and written skills.

Exchange students may take up this course unit, for which no prior knowledge of Dutch is required, as exchange students will be set an alternative exam.

Contents

This course unit covers the following topics:

- grammar exercises (use of tenses and modes, connectors, auxiliary verbs, (in) direct speech)
- vocabulary enrichment: a.o. argumentative vocabulary and thematic vocabulary (continuation)
- writing exercises ('dissertation')
- oral exercises, mainly in non-prepared contexts

Initial competences

To have completed the course French: Language Proficiency I or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 Critically reflecting in correct French on one's own thinking, learning, decision-making and acting and thus make adjustments.
- 2 Critically reflecting in correct French about social issues.
- 3 Thoroughly master the spelling of French, recognize and correct spelling errors.
- 4 Correctly apply the grammatical rules for simple and compound sentences and know the exceptions to them.
- 5 Demonstrate fluent and correct conversational skills.
- 6 Being able to make sound, coherent arguments orally on a wide range of socially relevant topics.
- 7 Understand, explain and apply certain techniques that promote textual coherence.
- 8 Being able to explain new lexical expressions and use them in the correct context.
- 9 Being able to write an argumentative text adapted to a target audience, without online tools.
- 10 Applying appropriate (digital) tools and information sources to report on socially relevant themes from the French-speaking world in a clear and correct way.

Evaluation moment

Periodical (65%)

The use of any generative AI system in written assessment is explicitly prohibited and may give rise to disciplinary procedures.

Non-periodical (35%)

Participation in all modules is required to succeed. Participation in every conversation class is required to succeed.

Evaluation form

Written assessment - skills test (5%) and exam: exercises on grammar, vocabulary, spelling (30%) and independently writing of a dissertation (35%).

Oral assessment: evaluation of the participation and oral skills during the obligatory conversation classes (20%).

Assignment - portfolio: interim oral process evaluation (explanation of roadmap, sources, interim versions ... (6%)) and final product evaluation (4%)

Calculation of the examination mark

Grammar, spelling and vocabulary (35%)

Essay (35%)

Oral skills (20%)

Portfolio (10%)

On evading any of the evaluation forms, one can no longer pass. If the mark would nevertheless be 10 or more out of 20, it will be reduced to the highest non-debatable mark (7/20).

Facilities for Working Students
