Position of the course

This advanced course wants to provide students with an outstanding knowledge of oral and written skills.

Exchange students may take up this course unit, for which no prior knowledge of Dutch is required, as exchange students will be set an alternative exam.

Contents

Consolidation of grammar, refining vocabulary, expansion of mastery in writing texts and in oral expression, spelling exercises, elements of francophone culture

Initial competences

To have completed the courses French language proficiency I and French language proficiency II or to have acquired the necessary skills by other means.

Final competences

- 1 To be able to express themselves fluently and in a correct way in oral and written French
- 2 To be able to argue in a complex and cohesive way, orally and in writing, without the use of online tools.
- 3 To be able to use connecting and signal words in a correct and varied way in argumentative texts.

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- 4 To show an extensive vocabulary.
- 5 To be able to write a personal argumentative essay about one of the current topics treated in class, without the use of online tools.
- 6 To be able to synthetize information and arguments from different sources and to reformulate them in a coherent text, without the use of online tools.
- 7 To show a critical attitude regarding his/her own proficiency and to take action in order to improve language skills
- 8 Acquire knowledge of francophone culture.
- 9 Applying appropriate (digital) tools and information sources to report on socially and culturally relevant themes from the French-speaking world in a clear and correct way
- 10 Critically reflecting in correct French on one's own thinking, learning, decision-making and acting and thus make adjustments.
- 11 Critically reflecting in correct French about social and cultural issues.

- Group work: debate and presentation
- Independent work: vocabulary enrichment, spelling, 2 syntheses, 1 personal comment, follow-up of the writing assignments, portfolio

Assessment moment

Periodical: exam

Non-periodical: continuous assessment. Participation in all modules is required to succeed. Participation in every test and in every oral class is required to succeed.

- Written: exercises on grammar, vocabulary, spelling and independently writing a synthesis and a personal comment.
- Oral: evaluation of the participation and the oral skills during obligatory conversation classes.
- Assignment Portfolio: process evaluation (the intermediate oral presentation, the oral defense and the portfolio dossier included)

Calculation of the examination mark

grammar, spelling, vocabulary (20%) synthesis and personal comment (40%) oral skills (20%) portfolio (20%)
